ABOUT NCDEU

NCDEU: An Annual Meeting Sponsored by ASCP is a scientific meeting that focuses on the latest developments in psychopharmacologic clinical research and related methodology. The theme of the 53rd Annual NCDEU is *Recognizing Unmet Needs in Psychopharmacology: From Biomarkers to Breakthrough Therapies*.

ABOUT THE NEW INVESTIGATOR PROGRAM

The NCDEU *New Investigators Program* is a unique career development experience for outstanding junior faculty, residents, and fellows interested in research who have not been the Principal Investigator on an NIH R01 grant. The program includes:

- A closed didactic workshop with senior investigators from NIMH, FDA, academia, and the pharmaceutical industry;
- Daily breakfast roundtables, with senior investigators and leaders in the field;
- The opportunity to present a poster at the NCDEU meeting;
- An award and travel/lodging stipend* presented at a special ceremony.

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Any established investigator may nominate individuals for the New Investigators' Award Program. Psychiatric residents and fellows, junior faculty, as well as psychology interns, graduate students or postdoctoral fellows, pharmacists, nurses, and social workers who have a special interest in clinical research and/or translational research should electronically submit:

1. a poster abstract, **
2. a letter of recommendation from their department chair or mentor,
3. a curriculum vitae, and
4. a one page description of their research/career goals
