

## FACULTY POSITION:

### ADDICTION PSYCHIATRIST

The Department of Psychiatry at Rush University Medical Center in Chicago, Illinois is seeking an academic addiction psychiatrist to lead its addiction program. The ideal candidate will evince clinical expertise as well as the ability to develop a clinical-translational research program, and will be involved in training residents, medical students and faculty in this academic medical center. Candidates should have the ability to enhance and interface with clinical and research efforts at Rush University.

The Department of Psychiatry provides a broad array of clinical services including inpatient and outpatient programs for adult, child and geriatric patients, hospital-wide consultation-liaison and a day hospital. It has a number of active research programs across a range of disorders including affective disorders, anxiety, PTSD, psychosis and autism. The Department has strong local and national collaborations. Within Rush Medical Center, these include collaborations with Behavioral Sciences, Preventive Medicine, the Center for Compulsive Behavior and Addiction, a research-oriented center with a large complement of preclinical neuroscientists, as well as a P30-supported Center for AIDS Research.

The Department of Psychiatry at Rush University is located within the Illinois Medical District and thus is affiliated with Stroger Hospital of Cook County, the Rothstein Center for the Prevention, Care and Research of Infectious Diseases, and the University of Illinois at Chicago. The District occupies 560 acres in Chicago's near west side, and houses 2,200 hospital beds and receives over 75,000 visitors daily. As the nation's largest urban biotechnology/medical district, the District also generates approximately \$220 million in research annually.

Applicants must have an M.D. or M.D./Ph.D. degree, be Board-Certified in Psychiatry and eligible for licensure in Illinois. Initial rank and compensation will depend on experience and qualifications.
