

## The Richman Family Professor for Alzheimer's and Related Disease Director, Division of Geriatric Psychiatry and Neuropsychiatry

The Division of Geriatric Psychiatry and Neuropsychiatry is a major clinical, research, and teaching program located in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences that builds on a long tradition of excellence in clinical care and scholarship in geriatric psychiatry and neuropsychiatry. The program has focused on diagnosis, treatment and research in late-life psychiatric and neuropsychiatric disorders including Alzheimer's, early onset dementias, fronto-temporal dementia, traumatic brain injury, Parkinson's disease, as well as late-life mood and psychotic disorders. It has also been the home for postdoctoral clinical training programs in Geriatric Psychiatry and in Neuropsychiatry for several decades. The program consists of 16 full time faculty and spans the Johns Hopkins East Baltimore and Bayview campuses. There are active collaborations with other departments in the School of Medicine (including Neurology Geriatric Medicine, Radiology, Neuropathology, Neuroscience), in the Bloomberg School of Public Health, the School of Nursing, the Homewood Campus of the Johns Hopkins University, as well as the National Institute on Aging and National Institute on Drug Abuse intramural programs located on the Johns Hopkins Bayview Campus.

Potential candidates must be board-certified or eligible in Geriatric Psychiatry or Neuropsychiatry Candidates should either be at the rank of Professor at their current institution, or qualified for appointment as a Professor in the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine. Candidates are expected to have demonstrated a strong, multi-year record of independent funding as a Principal Investigator on NIH grants (or the equivalent), leadership of clinical programs in geriatric psychiatry, administrative skills, a record of international recognition for their work and a record of exceptional mentoring and teaching. Candidates with clinical and research backgrounds in any area of geriatric psychiatry and/or neuropsychiatry and related fields are welcome to apply. Critical to the selection of the Director of the Division of Geriatric Psychiatry and Neuropsychiatry will be the ability to demonstrate a clear vision for the direction of geriatric psychiatry and neuropsychiatry and the role that the Division should play in leading clinical practice, education and research at the national and international level.
