

INITIATION OF SEARCH PSYCHOSOMATIC MEDICINE (CONSULTATION/LIAISON PSYCHIATRY) ASSISTANT PROFESSOR, ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR, or FULL PROFESSOR (University Tenure Line or Medical Center Line) PSYCHIATRY AND BEHAVIORAL SCIENCES VAPAHCS

The Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at Stanford University School of Medicine is seeking a full-time faculty member at the rank of Assistant Professor, Associate Professor, or Full Professor in the Medical Center Line or the University Tenure Line to conduct clinical care, teaching, and research in the field of Psychosomatic Medicine. The position will be based at the Veterans Affairs Palo Alto Health Care System with presence in the Departmental programs on the Stanford campus.

The chosen candidate will be expected to act as a resource for teaching and clinical research, and will be required to have proven clinical, administrative, and clinical research interests in adult psychiatry, in addition to excellence in clinical teaching. They will be expected to take an active role in teaching Stanford psychiatry residents. Clinical and teaching experience in the area of Psychosomatic Medicine (Consultation/Liaison Psychiatry) is required.

Applicants must have a medical degree or equivalent degree, completed training in General Psychiatry, be board-certified in General Psychiatry by July 2012, and possess or be fully eligible for a California medical license. In addition, subspecialty certification or board-eligibility in Psychosomatic Medicine (Consultation/Liaison Psychiatry) is desired.

The predominant criterion for appointment in the University Tenure Line is a major commitment to research and teaching. The major criteria for appointment in the Medical Center Line is excellence in the overall mix of clinical care, clinical teaching, scholarly activity that advances clinical medicine, and institutional service appropriate to the programmatic need the individual is expected to fulfill.
