The Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at Stanford University School of Medicine is seeking a full-time Assistant Professor in the Medical Center Line. This is a clinical, research, and teaching position that will be based at the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences.

The Department is seeking a physician-scientist who is fluent in key aspects of several scientific disciplines in addition to psychiatry, and able to effectively incorporate such interdisciplinary knowledge into a cohesive approach to research and clinical care. The successful candidate will conduct cross-disciplinary clinical neuroscience research, provide specialized clinical care for children and adults, and contribute to the teaching and mentoring of Stanford trainees in psychiatry and medical students. Excellent clinical training and an established track record of research are expected. Experience conducting multi-dimensional psychiatric research that integrates conceptual and factual information across related dimensions of inquiry, such as neuroimaging, neuroscience, behavioral science, and/or genomics, is desired. Applicants must have a medical degree or equivalent degree, completed training in General Psychiatry, be board-certified in General Psychiatry, be a board-certified or board-eligible in a Psychiatry or Neurology Subspecialty by July 2013, and possess or be fully eligible for a California medical license.

General criteria for the Medical Center Line (MCL) are:

“The major criteria for appointment, reappointment and promotion for faculty in the MCL shall be excellence in the overall mix of clinical care, clinical teaching, scholarly activity that advances clinical medicine, and institutional service.”
